Club Volleyball is separate from varsity level sports and therefore runs quite differently. Virginia Tech Women's Club Volleyball is currently a member of the Carolina Women's Club Volleyball League. Even though it isn't the varsity level sport this team still requires hard work and dedication to fulfill our goals and win tournaments. Club Volleyball is a great option for those that are in love with the sport and are dedicated but may not have as great of talents to play on the Virginia Tech varsity level team.

The Team

The two different teams are assigned based on skill levels and tryouts to become a part of the team take place twice a year. The tryouts occur at the beginning of both the fall and spring semesters here at Virginia Tech. At tryouts many different drills and full games will be used to asses the players different skills and abilities. Individuals will be asked to tryout in a specific position including the options of, middle, outside and right side hitter or as a libero or setter. Time and hard work are still major aspects for Club Volleyball due to the many practices and tournaments individuals must participate in. Practices are held Monday through Thursday in an on campus gym found in War Memorial Hall. Practice time is scheduled for 4pm to 6pm and all players are asked to schedule classes and other activities around these two hours, as best as possible. Open gyms are also available throughout the year but aren't mandatory. Open gyms are a good way to get to know some of the current players for those not already on the team. Other ways to get involved with club volleyball here at Virginia Tech include holding different office positions. As a club we vote and elect positions like Club President, Vice President, Treasurer and a few others. Some of the key tournaments our Club takes part in include the Nationals tournament and even our very own locally hosted tournaments.


The Expenses

The team also takes part in other fundraisers throughout the year to help cover some of the expenses. Placing in tournaments can also result in winning

large sums of money that are distributed among the players.

Glossary

Libero: A defensive specialist known for passing well that can only play the three positions found on the back row away from the net.

Middle Hitter: Typically the tallest player on the court that plays closest to the net hitting balls on the opposing side to score points.

Nationals: A tournament held in a large city somewhere within the United States where Club Volleyball teams from all around the nation compete.

Outside Hitter: A player who hits the ball on the front row from the left side in attempt to score points.

Right Side Hitter: A player who plays opposite of the setter and hits the ball to the opposing team to score points.


Setter: A specialist player on the court known for running the offense and passing the ball to hitters in order to score points.

Tournament: A series of games played between many different teams who are all competing for an overall prize or award.
